TENDERING PROCEDURES

PUBLIC PROCUREMENT AND HOW IS IT RELEVANT TO SCHOOLS

All public bodies, including schools, who receive more than 50% of their income from public funding are subject to National Public Procurement Rules and EU Directives when engaging in sourcing activity for goods and services. Consequently, there is a legal obligation on schools to undertake a competitive process prior to awarding any contract for goods or services.

CURRENT NATIONAL AND EU PROCUREMENT THRESHOLDS

The value of each purchase represents the projected cost of the overall term of the contract.
